# Short-term Program

- A 2~4 week program that allows intensive learning of Korean language and culture during vacations or holidays.
- Providing various cultural programs (K-POP dance, Taekwondo, Korean food making, performances, etc.) for the experience of Korean culture
- Uses Dongguk University's exclusive textbook (E-BOOK) 「Dongguk Korean (Short-term Program)」 to teach basic Hangeul (consonants/vowels), essential vocabulary, grammar, and skills (speaking, listening, reading, writing) related to each topic.

## Eligibility

Applicants must be from visa-exempt countries or hold a valid visa (tourist, overseas Korean) and must be legally eligible to stay in Korea.  
The university does not provide visa issuance support.

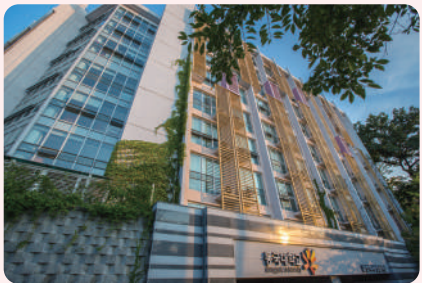

# Namsan Dormitory

Institute of Korean Language students can live safely on campus in the Namsan Dormitory.

- Namsan Dormitory: Dormitory on campus with a view of Namsan Seoul Tower, 2 people per room

- Free gym for dormitory residents.

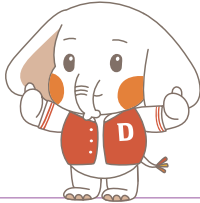




# Student support programs



We help language trainees adapt to school life and Korean culture through language and cultural exchanges with Korean students at Dongguk University.



To help language trainees adapt to school life and manage stress, professional psychological counselors are invited to run a psychological counseling program dedicated to foreign language trainees. (available in Korean, English, Chinese, etc.)



We provide counseling services to language trainees who wish to enter Dongguk University's undergraduate (graduate) school, and have a scholarship exclusive to students from the Korean Language Center.



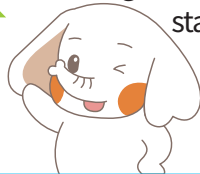
It is an intensive exam preparation for the TOPIK exam. Any regular course student can take the class for free.

For the convenience of language trainees, we run an immigration agency service to handle matters related to immigration, such as alien registration and extension of stay.



It is a TOPIK test center designated by the National Institute for International Education where more than 3,000 foreigners a year take a TOPIK test at Dongguk University.

# Regular course admission

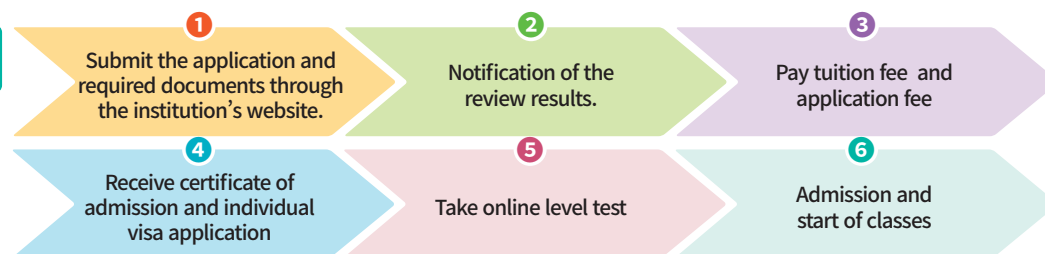
**Eligibility** Foreign nationals or overseas Koreans with a high school diploma or higher.

**Academic schedule** • 10-week course per semester (200 hours)

- **Application Schedule:** Applicants requiring a D-4 visa must apply at least 4 weeks before the start of the semester. Applicants not requiring a D-4 visa can apply up to 2 weeks before the start of the semester.
- The academic schedule is subject to change.

## Registration Process



- Step 4 is only for applicants requiring a D-4 visa. The visa application must be submitted directly by the student to the overseas diplomatic mission (embassy/consulate) of their country.
- The standard admission letter will only be issued if registering for two or more semesters.
- The number of semesters registered and required documents vary by country, so be sure to inquire in advance.
- Additional documents may be required depending on the reason, and submitted documents will not be returned.

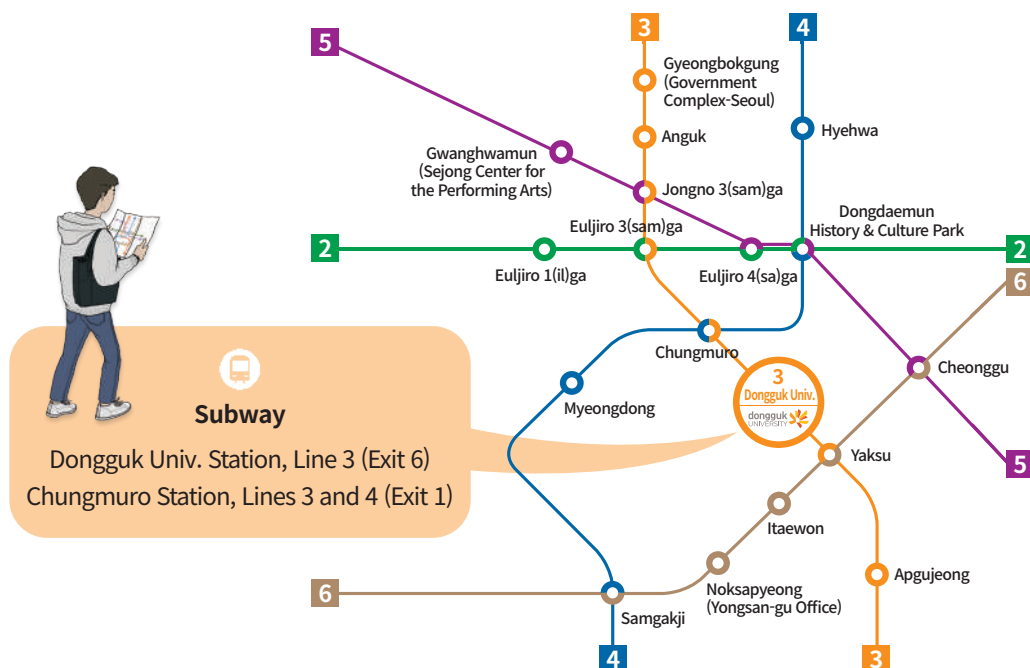
- 1) Final Degree Graduation Certificate: Copy
- 2) Financial Proof (OECD countries, Hong Kong, Macau, Taiwan, Singapore, etc.): Submit a 6-month bank transaction history or a balance certificate. The account holder's name must be the applicant's own name. The issue date must be within 1 month from the submission date. A minimum balance of 10,000,000 KRW (based on applying for 2 semesters). If the transaction history under the applicant's name is unavailable, documents under the parent's name can be submitted. If submitting documents under the parent's name, proof of family relationship must be provided.
- 3) Financial Proof (Non-OECD countries): A balance certificate is required. The account holder's name must be the applicant's own name. The issue date must be within 1 month from the visa application date. The freeze period should be the end date of the course plus 15 days, with a frozen amount of 20,000,000 KRW (based on applying for 4 semesters).
- 4) Gap Evidence (OECD countries, Hong Kong, Macau, Taiwan, Singapore, etc.): Only required if more than 2 years have passed since the final school graduation. A resume (Resume or CV) is required.
- 5) Gap Evidence (Non-OECD countries): Only required if more than 1 year has passed since the final school graduation. A resume (Resume or CV) + gap evidence (such as a certificate of employment or work experience) is required.
