




ADMISSION PROCEDURE



APOSTILLE CERTIFICATE INFORMATION

The Apostille is a certification in French to certify the authenticity of the documents. All applicants' public documents including the certificates of enrollment, academic transcript, and degree, should be authenticated by the attachment of an internationally recognized form of authentication known as an apostille. If not, they instead need to submit academic documents authenticated by consular legalization stamps.



QUALIFICATIONS FOR UNDERGRADUATE ADMISSION

FRESHMEN ADMISSION

Successful applicants must 1. hold a high-school diploma or above and 2. hold a TOPIK certificate of level 3 or higher.

TRANSFER ADMISSION

Successful applicants must 1. have completed at least 2 years of undergraduate education or above, and 2. hold a TOPIK certificate of level 3 or higher.

※ Every and each students must earn a TOPIK certificate of higher than level 4 before graduation.

· Every foreign student shall receive a 30% discount from the regular tuition.
· The tuitions above are the amount after the 30% discount is reflected.
· The tuitions are exclusive of admission fees(543,000 KRW).
· The applicants from partner institutions are exempt from paying admission fees.
· Holders of a TOPIK certificate of level 4, 5 and 6, shall receive a 40%, 50% and 60% discount to their tuition respectively in the first semester at BUFS.
· Foreign students are eligible for other kinds of scholarships stipulated by BUFS regulations.

DOCUMENTS TO SUBMIT

- ★ Application form
- ★ Self-introduction & Study plan
- ★ Copy of alien registration card(if applicable)
- ★ Copy of passport
- ★ Certificate of diploma of latest attended institution
- ★ Academic transcripts of latest attended institution
- ★ Certificate of family register(translated in English and notarized)
- ★ TOPIK Certificate of Level 3 or higher
- ★ A certificate of bank balance with at least 18,000 USD; must be issued within a month from the date of visa application.(In case the certificate of bank balance belongs to applicant's parent, a certificate of family register and certificate of employment of the parent should be presented.)
- ★ 3 color photos(3.5cm X 4.5cm) with white backgrounds

· Applicants' Certificate of diploma should be authenticated by the attachment of an apostille. Otherwise, it should be authenticated by consular legalization stamps.
· Submitted documents will not be returned to the applicants.
· In the event that an applicant has been admitted on the basis of false information given in the application, the admission will be cancelled.

- Hold either a TOPIK certificate of level 3(level 4 for those applying for master's program, level 5 for doctorate program in Korean Language Education as Foreign Language) or a certificate of English skills [TOEFL : 550(pbt), 210(cbt), 80(ibt), TEPS(550)]

Every and each student must earn a TOPIK certificate of higher than level 4 before graduation.
